GRYC MC Spring Regatta

May 19 - 20, 1990, Grand Rapids, MI

There was a big run on hot tubs, hot showers and hot toddies after this year's GRYC MC regatta. Mother Nature did not smile! Cold, rainy weather with heavy winds on Saturday and drizzle with moderate winds on Sunday chilled the fleet. But, hey, it was better than 80° and no wind. Fleet Captain Ted Maitland's promises better weather next year.

A record number of MCs (53) showed up this year and got in some serious-type racing and it came down to the last race with Charlie Harrett 1-1/4 points ahead of Jim Gluck of North Sails. Coming up the last leg it looked like it was Jim's third straight regatta title this year (Mid-Winters and Black Tie) as he had put five boats between himself and Charlie.

I asked Charlie Harrett to give me a run-down not only of the crucial last race but the total regatta. Boiled down, here's what he had to say. "With the heavy winds on Saturday I kept the traveler off to the cockpit edge (Ed. And he says there is no need to pull it in downwind), used lots of vang, and eased the main sheet in the shots. I played the left side of the course all day long as it was favored, except during the last race when the wind moved a bit more to the north. The winds were east 12-18 Saturday and slightly less on Sunday. I had good starts Saturday by looking for holes where the boat above or below was not too big a threat. The main thing during this regatta was to read the wind and get on the lifts. Boat speed meant nothing(!)."

By the end of the three races on Saturday, Jim was one point ahead of Charlie and four ahead of Brian McMurray.

In the first race Sunday morning Charlie had what he figured was his worst start having to flop over on port and take about ten transoms. But as sometimes happens, he got a huge lift up the right side and headed the fleet at the windward mark. Paul Richards caught him on the downwind leg but Charlie regained the lead to win this race. Paul was second and Jim finished third.

Going into the final race, Charlie now had a 1-1/2 point lead on Jim. The two boats were overlapped at the first windward mark and before long Jim had put five boats between himself and Charlie. Charlie figure he was dead. However, on the final beat Charlie tried to drag Jim over to the rightside of the course which was less favored, hoping some of the boats between them would get ahead of Jim and drag Jim back to him. And that was what happened, although near the finish line it looked like Bret Hatton, roaring in from the left, might get between them and it would be Jim's regatta. But at the last minute Bret hit a header and Charlie slid over the line just after Jim to win by 1/4 point!
