1980 NATIONAL REGATTA - MC CLASS - OCTOBER 3-4-5, LAKE ARKABUTLA, MISS.

Sponsor: Fleet #13, Delta Sailing Association - Memphis, Tennessee

Thirty-one boats participated, coming from Michigan, Wisconsin, Georgia, Texas, La. Florida, Oklahoma and Memphis fleet.

Course sailed was two triangles and a windward leg. Conditions were cloudy, temperature 57 - 72° in the sun, when you could find it! Winds, sometimes 5-8, mostly 18-22, gusting to 30 knots, unreal 90° shifts. 75% of fleet carried crews in scow usually single-handed. Capsizes were many and writer lost count! For conditions, boat damage was minimal, although several skippers went home with bent spars. One unfortunate had his mast break in his hand as he tipped boat at dock to drain it between races.

Race #1 got underway Friday afternoon in winds 15-18, gusting to 22, with waves many proclaimed 2-3', and unwary were initiated to the wind shifts peculiar to this lake. Host Henry Tipton capsized at the start, swam his boat ashore; on reaching the dock he injured his knee and retired to his shore duties for the rest of the regatta. 3rd downwind leg saw mid-pack boats bunch up and many collisions. Finish order, Fox, Freytag, Kopp, Reuterdahl, Verplank.

Race #2 - Same conditions. From the start Willi Lenkeit left the pack, and held a good lead till Happy Fox caught him and took another 1st. 2nd, Lenkeit, 3rd Moss, 4th Verplank, 5th Huck.

Race #3 Saturday morning was abandoned. Winds 20-25, gusting to 30, and blowing straight in to shore, preventing boats from leaving dock.

Race #4, the wind had abated somewhat. Bill Freytag got a great early lead, and Gary Verplank closed the gap for 2nd, Fox 3rd, Welch 4th and Lenkeit 5th.

Race 5 - was a hair raiser as winds increased almost to "survival" level. Verplank left no doubt he would hold onto to his early lead and take lst. Fox 2nd, Freytag 3, Welch 4, Huck 5th.

Race 6 - Sunday AM temperatures warmed, wind abated to 5-8; many crews were left at the dock---mistake! Wind picked up 12-15, gusting to 18, with increased shifts. Verplank 1st, Greene 2nd, Lenkeit 3rd, Fox 4th, Freytag 5th.

Race 7 - Winds held steady 12-15 with those pesky shifts. Bob Kwasha came out of the pack to hold a good lead till Happy Fox pulled another 1st out of his bag, followed over the finish line by Welch, Greene, Verplank and Dorn. Sponsor - Fleet #13 - Delta Sailing Association, Memphis, Tenn.
