1 Organizing Authority

1.1 The Organizing Authority for this regatta is the Lake Beulah Yacht Club (LBYC).

2 Rules

2.1 The Sailing instructions will consist of the MCSA Standard Sailing Instructions available at the official regatta notice board, at the notice of race under www.mcscow.org, and this supplement.

3 Schedule

- 3.1 Five Races are scheduled.
- 3.2 No more than three races will be sailed in one day.

- 3.5 Subsequent races will follow. After going ashore, subsequent race warning times will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 3.6 On the last day of the regatta, no warning signal will be made after 1230 hours.
- 4 AP Ashore Delay. After Flag AP ashore is lowered, the next signal will be made not less than 45 Minutes later.

5 Signals made Ashore and Race Office.

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be flown from a docked Race Committee vessel.
- 5.2 The race office will be located in the main hall at Lake Beulah Yacht Club.

6 Marks & Line Flags

- 6.1 Original marks will be orange
- 6.2 Change marks will be orange
- 6.3 Line flags will be Orange

7 Time Limits

- 7.1 Mark 1 Time Limit: 30 Minutes
- 7.2 Race Time Limit: 90 Minutes
- 7.3 Finishing Window: 20 Minutes
- 7.4 Protest Time Limit: 60 Minutes after the Race Committee Finishing Boat returns to shore.

8 Communication

- 8.1 The Competitor VHF Channel is 72.
- The RC will use the Competitor VHF Channel to communicate about the racing, weather issues, safety concerns, and other actions where clarification may be helpful to the competitors.
- 8.3 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 8.4 A boat that retires shall inform the Race Committee as soon as practicable via the Competitor VHF Channel and/or by informing a Race Committee vessel verbally and/or by informing an event official ashore.

9 Scoring

- 9.1 The Low Point System of RRS Appendix A will apply.
- 9.2 When fewer than 7 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2.
- 9.3 One completed race constitutes a regatta for purposes of awarding Keeper & Perpetual Trophies. Awards will be based on her finishes in the overall fleet.

10 Outside Assistance

10.1 A capsized boat that receives outside assistance while righting or a crew member who is ill, injured, overboard, or in danger that receives outside assistance shall retire except: if receiving said assistance from another competitor boat in the same race you may continue racing without penalty. This changes RRS 41.
